**ICOM**—On November 13-16 Christians from throughout the country and world will gather for the International Conference on Missions. The theme is **Vertical**. The conference will include 24-hour prayer in the center of the exhibit area and in a hotel room from 11 p.m. To 7 a.m. Booth 650 will share what God is doing in Indonesia through Asia Pacific International. A large percentage of those attending will be under the age of 25. Each year many make a decision to serve in missions.

**API**—Founders Gi and Mei Tanbunaan are in the US this fall to visit family and friends as well as to meet with API supporters. In October they visited several California churches, attended a gathering at the Bob Snyder's home, traveled to several cities in the midwest and attended the API board meeting at Harvester Christian Church in Missouri. This past year API has planted 20 new churches. There have been 182 baptisms. One of the goals for 2015 is to reach five new provinces in Indonesia.

**Yosts**—Jim reported this month on how God is using him to share Jesus with young people in urban Papua. He recently spoke to one “Rapper family” that meets monthly. Most have never attended church, but they are led by a rapper who started following Jesus last year. He talked about one verse with them: *For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.*” After a lively discussion, the group made a decision to change the way they rap. No more will they rap about sex, violence and drugs. Now their lyrics will be

for the building up of the next generation. They also decided to meet semi-monthly, invite Jim to speak about spiritual things and have a monthly open-air concert to raise awareness for social issues.
